

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## Frederick Celtic Festival Benefitting Wounded Warriors



This year the Frederick Celtic Festival will be held at the Mt. Airy Carnival Grounds, Twin Arch Road, on Saturday, May 11, 2013 from 9 AM to 6 PM A night benefit concert (separate admission) will be held a the Main Pub Stage on the Carnival Grounds from 7 PM to 10 PM. 100% of all ticket sales for the Night Concert (\$10.00 per ticket) will be donated to two Wounded Warrior charities, the “Wounded Warrior Project” and “Operation Ward 57”.

Wounded Warriors who were wounded from 2002 to date are invited to attend the day and night events as guest of honor together with their immediate family at no charge. Transportation for those who are still in the hospital and rehabilitation centers will be coordinated.

There will be between 3-6 Wounded Warriors donning Kilts and competing alongside the professionals and amateurs on the athletic field in the Scottish Athletic competition.

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## 8th Annual Veterans Appreciation Day

The 8th Annual Veterans Appreciation Day will be held at the Izaak Walton League of America, Wildlife Achievement Chapter, 26430 Mullinix Mill Rd, Damascus, Md 21771 from 9 Am to 3:30 PM on Saturday, June 1, 2013.

Military Veterans from WW II to Iraq and Afghanistan will have the opportunity to enjoy the comradeship of fellow veterans and their families for a day filled with static displays including military vehicles, equipment, combat gear and gadgets. WW II reenactments, including live fire and flamethrower demonstrations, will also take place throughout the day. Veterans will also have the opportunity to shoot firearms from WW II through Vietnam to Afghanistan on the rifle and pistol ranges. Small caliber rifles and pistols will also be available for use by the veterans and their families. All necessary hearing and eye protection will be available for all participants.

Last, but not least, food and refreshments will also be available throughout the day at no cost for veterans.




## The Veterans and Family Support Program

This program is for our veterans and their families. It shows them we care and are here for them when they need us.

**VFW National Military Service:** Donations for this program go for Operation Uplink, Military Assistance program and the Unmet Needs program. Many of these veterans are deployed and it is so important to them to keep in touch with their families while so far away from home. Financial assistance is needed for the families left behind. While veterans are hospitalized for long periods of time it is vital that they be in touch with family members. The morale of these veterans is very important in the healing process. A card or package from home is so much appreciated. All donations go directly to VFW National Military Services 406 West 34th Street, Kansas City, MO 64111 and earmarked for “National Military Services”.

**Buddy Poppies:** The Buddy Poppy is a symbol recognized for support of our veterans. They are handmade by our disabled veterans. All donations go to support these disabled veterans. The Buddy Poppy is used in numerous ways to show our support for these veterans. Buddy Poppies are given out and any donation made goes to the Relief Fund which supports our veterans, their families and our National Home for Children.



**VFW National Home for Children:** Donations for this program provide assistance in maintaining many of the community buildings on campus as well as provide funds for the families living at the VFW National Home for Children. 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## A Personal Sentiment

Awhile back I asked my dad to write down his sojourns during his time spent in the Army during WW II. It took him some time to do it but he finally finished it, put it in a notebook and labeled it his journal. It contains pictures, and missives written by other members of his unit from their many reunions held over the years. For Christmas this past year, I had his journal printed and a copy given to his son and each of his grandchildren. It was one of the most precious gifts they have ever received.

As most veterans, there are parts of their service they will never speak and/or write about as the memories are still painful to this day. However, he managed to write quite a lot—some funny happenings and some very serious. I have always admired my dad for the kind of person he was and is still at the age of 89. His journal reflects that image I have always had. I would very much like to impart to everyone—take the time to talk to the veteran in your family, if still living, and ask them to put in their own words what their service was like and what it meant to them. Some have done this already and many have been published. If the veteran is no longer living, get the family members perspectives of what was imparted to them over the years. It will be one of the most endearing gifts to your family and yourself that you will ever receive.
